# **2021 FULBRIGHT THAI VISITING SCHOLAR PROGRAM (TVS)**

# **GENERAL INFORMATION/PROVISIONS:**

Fulbright Thailand (Thailand-United States Educational Foundation) announces its annual competition for Fulbright awards under the **Thai Visiting Scholar Program (TVS)** which offers grants to senior Thai scholars to lecture, pursue research or undertake special academic-related projects in the United States.

Selection will be based on professional qualifications of applicants, and on the quality and significance of their project proposals. Applicants are expected to explore in advance the most appropriate location for their research or lecturing projects and should be able to indicate that the proposed host institutions - universities, archives, institutes, etc. - are prepared to receive the scholars. Project proposals will be considered under a condition that the applicant submits an official letter of invitation from a U.S. institution along with his/her application.

Up to three (3) awards will be offered to university faculty lecturers and researchers in a Thai university or research institution during the 2021 academic year for a period of 3-6 months. Funding for this program is through the Thailand-United States Educational Foundation under the Fulbright Program, and includes round-trip international travel, monthly stipend, professional allowance, settling-in allowance, health insurance and excess baggage reimbursement. The monthly stipend based on survey data on the city's relative cost of living. An additional allowance (approximately US\$200-350 per month) is given for qualified dependents who accompany the scholar for at least 80 percent of the grant period. Eligible dependents include the legal spouse and children under 21.

## **ELIGIBILITY:**

At the time of application, an applicant must:

- 1. Be a Thai citizen in good health, age not exceeding 58 at the time of application deadline; (individuals holding U.S. immigrant visas or permanent U.S. resident cards (green cards), or dual citizenships (Thai and U.S.) are not eligible to apply);
- Be physically present in Thailand at the time of interview;
- Have a doctorate in academic background with strong knowledge of English;
- 4. Professional experiences:
  - for university lecturers: have at least 10 years (120 months at the time of submission deadline) of lecturing experience at the university level (excluding period of study);
  - for researchers: have at least 10 years (120 months at the time of submission deadline) of research experience at the research institutions (excluding period of study);
- 5. Obtain an official letter of invitation from a U.S. host institution;
- 6. Be able to take leave from your home institution or professional organization;
- 7. Preferably not have had extensive experience in the United States during the previous 3 years;
- 8. Be able to fully participate in every activity organized by Fulbright Thailand, including Preliminary Orientation and Predeparture Orientation Program, which will be held in January and June respectively;

- 9. Be willing and able to serve as a resource person and a cultural ambassador in the United States, e.g. as a lecturer, seminar participant, consultant, or in other capacities requested by the host institution or community; and;
- 10. Be prepared to lecture and participate in academic activities related to the program undertaken upon return to Thailand.
- 11. Candidates may not have held a Fulbright grant for lecturing or research in the U.S. within the past 5 years;
- 12. Those who work for the U.S. Embassy and related agencies, please consult Fulbright Thailand before applying.

# 2021 FULBRIGHT JUNIOR RESEARCH SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM (JRS)

## **GENERAL INFORMATION/PROVISIONS:**

Fulbright Thailand (Thailand-U.S. Educational Foundation), in cooperation with the Thailand Research Fund (TRF), is pleased to announce the "Fulbright - Thailand Research Fund (TRF) Junior Research Scholarship Program (JRS)," which is aimed to develop the capabilities of Thai university staff members and interested persons to gain six months of research experience in the United States as part of their doctoral dissertation requirements.

Five (5) grants are available for the 2021 academic year. Two (2) will be awarded under the Fulbright Program and up to three (3) will be under the Fulbright-TRF partnership. For the grant sponsored by Fulbright Thailand, benefits are intended to cover round-trip international airfare, monthly stipend for six months, in-transit allowance and health insurance. For the Fulbright-TRF partnership, funding support will be mainly provided by the Thailand Research Fund (TRF) with additional fund from Fulbright Thailand for a period not exceeding six months.

Fulbright Thailand will assist the grantees in the visa process, coordinate with the host U.S. institutions and offer non-monetary benefits, including orientations, enrichment seminars, international conferences, etc., which will help grantees to get access to their chosen host universities and create quality international networks.

#### **ELIGIBILITY:**

At the time of application, an applicant must:

- 1. Be **physically present in Thailand** at the time of the orientation. Successful pre-screened applicants are required to have a virtual interview.
- 2. Be a Thai citizen in good health (individuals holding U.S. immigrant visas or permanent U.S. resident cards / green cards, or dual citizenships (Thai and U.S.) are not eligible to apply);
- 3. Be a university lecturer OR interested persons who are undertaking graduate work at the Ph.D. level in a Thai university;
- 4. Have completed your coursework and passed the qualifying exam;
- 5. Demonstrate strong academic performance at the graduate level;
- 6. Have an appropriate background to undertake the proposal you have outlined;
- 7. Have the concurrence of the university Ph.D. program in which you are enrolled;
- 8. Have one of the following valid English official score reports:
  - a. iBT TOEFL score of 71:
  - b. ITP TOEFL score of 525;
  - c. CU-TEP test score of 75.
- 9. Obtain an official letter of invitation from a U.S. host institution/advisor will supervise the research;
- 10. Be able to take leave from your home institution or professional organization;
- 11. Preferably not have had extensive experience in the United States during the previous 5 years; and
- 12. Be able to fully participate in every activity organized by Fulbright Thailand, including Preliminary Orientation and Pre-departure Orientation Program, which will be held in January and June respectively.

# Plagiarism Policy

The Fulbright Program offers grants to study, teach and conduct research for U.S. citizens to come to Thailand and for Thai citizens to come to the United States. The objectives are to foster mutual understanding and share knowledge. It is essential that this understanding and knowledge be based on intellectual honesty. Fulbright therefore requires all grant applications, papers, research projects and academic presentations to be free of all forms of plagiarism. Plagiarism by applicants or grantees shall be grounds for immediate rejection of applications and cancellation of grants.

# What is plagiarism?

Plagiarism is the use of another's ideas, words or information without appropriate attribution. It is intellectual theft, whether committed intentionally or unintentionally.

# What could be plagiarized?

Information, words, charts or images from both published and unpublished sources in any language and by any contributor, including oneself. All such information, words, charts or images must be correctly and fully attributed to their sources.

Common knowledge that is easily found needs no attribution, but when in doubt, provide attribution.

Types of plagiarism (adapted from Turnitin, 2016, cited in IIE webinar)

### **COPYING and QUOTATION**

- · with or without a slight change of words
- without quotation marks and appropriate attribution

#### **PARAPHASING**

 citing from one or more sources with only slight changes of words without appropriate attribution

# PROBLEMATIC ATTRIBUTION

inaccurate, incomplete or non-existent attribution

## **UNETHICAL COLLABORATION**

citing collaborative work without giving credit to the partner(s)

### **SELF-PLAGIARISM**

citing or copying one's own previously published work without attribution

#### **NON-ORIGINALITY**

· composing entire content from citations without any of the author's own ideas

## Acceptable attribution

- Naming the source of the copied words or information in the text
- Using footnotes or end notes, ensuring these are complete and correct. Note that Word and other
  word processing software provide tools for creation of footnotes and endnotes. Also note that free
  citation generators are available online
- Inclusion in a bibliography may be a necessary, but not always sufficient attribution.

### Plagiarism checking

If you have any doubts about plagiarism in your text, use one of the plagiarism checkers available online or ask your university to provide plagiarism checking software. The Fulbright program will be using such software and if violations are found, action shall be taken immediately.
